	Juliette Hoss – Sustainability Coordinator of Egremont. Instrumental in advancing a compost station at the Egremont transfer station. There are certain circumstances in Egremont that we don't have – highway dept being one. Also, Juliette is the point person, keeping an eye on the composting project and keeping it clean and going smoothly.	Aretha and Mark to ask Sean – did an engineering study happen? If not, is there any intention to do this?
	Veronique Blanchard, from DEP – on hand to support any initiatives in GB. Will join the next meeting with Sean VD in order to see what's possible. Mark will check in with her to see what we should recommend to the Selectboard.	
	Recommendation to the SB – how wide of a scope should we recommend? Unclear right now. Same issue remains of budget and resources to do this at the transfer station. Letter- supporting grant funding for any assessment work that could be done to plan for future compost operations on the town level.	
	Jovanina – there was some talk about a transfer station engineering study. What happened with that?	
	Aretha – Center for Eco Technologies. Will explore what Franklin county did.	
	Mark – from his research, upward of 25% of the GB waste is food waste that could be composted, Sean didn't know about this. Would like to figure out how to support Stanton Home in some kind of public/private partnership.	
	Jovanina – wants to make sure that someone has their eye on possible grants so that all this work doesn't just end up in a series of recommendations that don't necessarily go anywhere.

Net Zero Energy Research	Definition – building a house/building that produce as much energy as it uses. Future, creating more energy and sharing it locally. Three are some initiatives in CA and internationally around this – not sure how it's going, though. Ed May – in touch with him. General trend in energy codes towards net-zero – not much movement here. Costs are prohibitive upfront so contractors and buyers are reluctant to make this investment, despite long-term payback. Code over the last 15 years has improved dramatically, though. Jesse doesn't think it's worth putting a significant effort in this direction right now. Natalie – what did Ed say about local building with bigger buildings? How much is being built and what type of buildings? At what scale? A lot of the net zero regulations are for new buildings or for significant renovations. Stretch code- has GB opted into, adopted the MA stretch code?
