## Great Barrington Tree Committee Meeting Wednesday, December 21 2022, 5pm Great Barrington Town Hall

Approval of previous meeting's notes, unanimous approval from all members

I. Tree Warden Report

- Everett street: 2 trees removed (Norway maple, sugar maple) in decline, poor structural condition
- II. Discussion with Joe Aberdale of the Department of Public Works regarding planting budget
  - Budget:
    - Current budget has no money allocated for trees, need to ask for funds from DPW or town budget when specific needs arise
    - Tree removal/maintenance budget is roughly \$115K
    - How to get money to fund town tree projects: town meeting approval, grants, CPC (community preservation)
    - If by June 30 there is extra DPW budget it may be able to be reapplied to street trees
    - Residents can gift the town money to plant trees as well
  - Process:
    - DPW approves all tree costs, not just in parks
    - DPW doesn't borrow the money for a project that has been approved until it's ready to be utilized
    - Tree removal goes through warden (M. Peretti) then needs to be approved and executed by DPW
    - Selectboard meeting approves utility (National Grid) tree removals
    - Tree projects associated with parks should coordinate with CPC Parks Commissioner (Karen Smith)
    - Can be challenging to know where the property line is between private residences and town
  - Project Updates:
    - 9 new trees in Housatonic paid for by park dept; \$12,000 quote reduced to \$3,400 by planting bare root trees
    - Town approved a landscaper in the 2023 budget; Main Street gardens top concern
    - # of trees removed in 2020: 44 from warden;, 107 from National Grid
    - # of trees removed in 2022: 27 warden / 20 NG (are these final 2022 numbers?)


- Roundabout has seen multiple DUI/DWI that have impacted trees; DPW working to improve safety
- Opportunities:
  - Dewey park has space for trees
  - West ave from castle to maple, Lewis from west to Berkshire heights sidewalk extension project may require tree removal of large pines
- Action Items:
  - Prioritize some projects with budget for 2024 in time for March 2023 budget planning; Joe will incorporate in to 2024 capital budget
  - Get buy-in from impacted town residents and ask them to join the town meeting to vote to approve budget
  - Let residents know about town gift/memorial program
  - Talk to Parks commission about Dewey Park tree planting public hearings may be scheduled soon
  - There may be opportunities to get involved with Main Street and roundabout plantings
  - Long term planning as an agenda item in every Tree Committee meeting

III. Tree City USA application

- Julie received materials to restart application process
- 2019 last time we were engaged
- Action Item: Julie to send Mike the info she needs to complete the application

IV. Planting plans for sections of Everett Street and Hollenbeck Avenue
