- 1. Notice of Intent (DEP File #167-0431) from Foresight Land Services on behalf of the Town of Great Barrington. The subject property is the "Old Route 7 Road-Bed between the parking lots of the Barrington Brewery to the South and the CHP complex to the North. The Town proposes to construct a new Multi-Use Path along the existing sewer and abandoned State Highway Right of Way. The proposed project will include construction of a retaining wall, installation of signage, painting proposed pavement, site grading to insure handicap accessibility and will result in no permanent alteration of any wetland resource area. - 2. Notice of Intent (DEP File # 167-0432) from ESS Group on behalf of the Massachusetts Division of Fisheries and Wildlife. The subject property is the Agawam Lake Wildlife Management Area located along Stockbridge Road and Monument Valley Road, Map 35 Lots 2 & 7A and Map 39 Lot 21. The applicant proposes to implement a Habitat Management Plan including invasive plant control, general vegetation control, beaver related flooding control and prescribed controlled burning. Each of these activities is designed to improve wildlife habitat functions and restore significant wetland ecosystems. (Discussion/Roll Call Vote)

Update and discussion of a WPA Enforcement Order of 5/11/2020 and a MESA Notice of Non-Compliance of 5/14/2020 issued by the GB Conservation Commission and the Mass Natural Heritage Program, respectively, to Moses Clark LLC, Andrew McMaster, Trustee, property at 518 Egremont Road, Map 31 Lot 101. Violations include substantial unpermitted alteration of, and storage of heavy equipment and construction materials upon, mapped Bordering Vegetated Wetland, Flood Plain, Priority Habitat of Rare Species and Estimated Habitat of Rare Wildlife.
