Notice of Intent (DEP File # 167-0455) from Solitude Lake Management on behalf of URJ Eisner Camp for an Aquatic and Mechanical Management Program for Camp Eisner Pond to control Invasive and/or Nuisance Aquatic Vegetation through USEPA/MA registered Mechanical techniques or hand pulling. Continued at the Applicant's request from July 26, 2023.
- Wetland Resource Area Assessment & Restoration Plan from Stockman Associates on behalf of Cindy Granahan, property at #6 Ramsey Avenue, Map 15 Lot 22. The proposed work is a restoration of an altered BVW including removal of a gravel pile, removal of historic junk piles and concrete walkway, replacement and regrading of hydric soils and installation of a split rail fence.
