

# MEDICARE PART D AND PART C OPEN ENROLLMENT

Just a reminder to everyone that the Medicare Part D (drug plans) and Part C (Medicare Advantage Plans) open enrollment is October 15-December 7. If you want to switch your plan for 2014 you must do it during this time. If you have one of these plans, you should be receiving a packet of information from your current plan labeled "Notice of Change" before October 15. In this packet you will find out if your plan is changing in any way. For the drug plans make sure all your meds are still covered and look to see if the premium, deductible and/or co-pays have changed. Look at all the medical and drug coverage for the Advantage Plans (e.g. Health New England HMO or AARP Medicare Complete Choice) and make sure it's still right for you.

Medicare's open enrollment isn't part of the new Health Insurance Marketplace plans which start in 2014. These are plans for people who do not have Medicare and they won't have any effect on your Medicare coverage. DO NOT share your Medicare number or other personal information with anyone who knocks on your door or contacts you uninvited to sell you a health plan!

# UPCOMING CHANGES TO S.N.A.P. (Food Stamps) BENEFITS

Although some seniors may see benefit increases in October, 2013 due to an increase in the standard deduction, the revision of the American Recovery Reinvestment Act will cause a subsequent decrease in November, 2013.

If you have concerns about how these changes may affect your monthly benefit amount, please contact the **FoodSource Hotline** at **1-800-645-8333** for a screening. Counselors can give you an idea if these changes will affect you, and if so, to what extent. Counselors can also ensure recipients are taking advantage of all available deductions that may limit the decrease they see.

When you call, please have the following information available to ensure an accurate screening benefit amount: **gross** income from sources such as social security, pensions, bank interest, etc.; monthly rent/mortgage,

property tax, homeowners' insurance, and medical expenses including monthly insurance premiums.

FoodSource Hotline Counselors are available to assist callers in over 160 languages Monday-Friday 8:00 AM to 7:00 PM and Saturdays 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM., or via LiveChat or www.gettingsnap.org.


