C. PUBLIC HEARING -232 Stockbridge Road- To review, uphold, or amend the March 2021 Correction Order following the January, 19<sup>th</sup> 2021 Inspection of all four dwelling units located at 232 Stockbridge Road and to entertain a vote to condemn Unit 3 for conditions that fail to meet the minimum requirements of Human Habitation per 105 CMR 410.000.

Motion to open Approved: 3-0

Board of Health Speak Time: Rebecca Jurczyk introduced a power point presentation for an overview of the Health Department's continuing involvement.

- A 2017 carbon monoxide leak caused resident to be taken to the hospital which triggered an emergency condemnation order. The re-inspection in 2018 determined the four units were unoccupied.
- In January, 2021 a re-inspection of the four units was performed and they were occupied.
- A Correction Order was issued and received by the property owner on March 12<sup>th</sup>, 2021. Thirty days' notice was given to have all the violations amended.
- After discussion of the issues in each dwelling it was decided that the Building Inspector should perform an inspection. It was also recommended to hold off on an order of condemnation until the Building Inspector's report is complete. A motion to move the public hearing to April 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021 was presented and approved 3-0 by the Board of Health.
- Motion to close the Public Hearing Roll Call Vote: Approved 3-0

Rebecca Jurczyk: A Manganese study is being performed, but there have been no comments from D.E.P.

Ruby Chang: Manganese is more common in the summer. It is a Public Health concern.
