A. General Comments by the Board

Ms. Tabakin gave an update on a possible "Flushable" wipes bylaw. Ms. Tabakin suggested the verbiage, "All current and future users of the Great Barrington are restricted from discharging any product other than toilet paper into the public sewer system." Sean Stanton said his position on the

matter is that there should be a bylaw banning the sale of "flushable" wipes or not passing a bylaw at all. Mr. Stanton said a ban of sale is enforceable whereas banning what people flush is not.
