Compost update	Marc met with Sean VD. Main question: is it possible to replicate Sheffield's compost project? Is it realistic and worth pursuing. Sean does think pursuing it makes sense. Town did not apply for the Community Compact Best Practices grant, but is willing to pursue this with the support and help of the committee. Marc would like help from another committee member to put together the grant application, with the intention of submitting something within the next month. Aretha is happy to help! As is John. Marc will organize the effort and reach out this weekend. Didn't talk about the possibility of a different location other than the transfer station. Regarding the sign for waste diversion at the transfer station, we just need to run it by him, but it's not as important as the grant at this point. Jovanina is interested in having the sign be something that is more of a community effort — youth, art, etcA design contest for science/art collaboration at MMRHS? John mentioned that Pittsfield has a compost project happening, access to an actual composter for residents.

	Natalie mentioned the conversation that happened at the end of the first forum amongst farmers, who said that it's hard to talk about farming locally if it isn't possible to live here. Natalie wondered if the Conway team was taking this conversation into consideration. Vivian said that the Conway advisors recommended that they not cover this issue as its complexity is beyond the scope of their work, even though the issue of food access is directly related to affordability, work force issues, and transportation.
