Mark's final meeting	Mark is transitioning off the committee. Natalie appreciated all of his work over the entirety of the existence of the committee, particularly noting the amount of work he put into the MVP grant application. Jovanina appreciated the partnership around the pre-MVP grant work, in particular the community event that was so much work! Mark was wanting be engaged meaningfully in civic engagement on a local level. Learned a lot about what can happen at a Town level, looking forward to new relationships and engagement, either in New Marlborough or GB.
