- ✓ Be mindful of Great Barrington's Master Plan

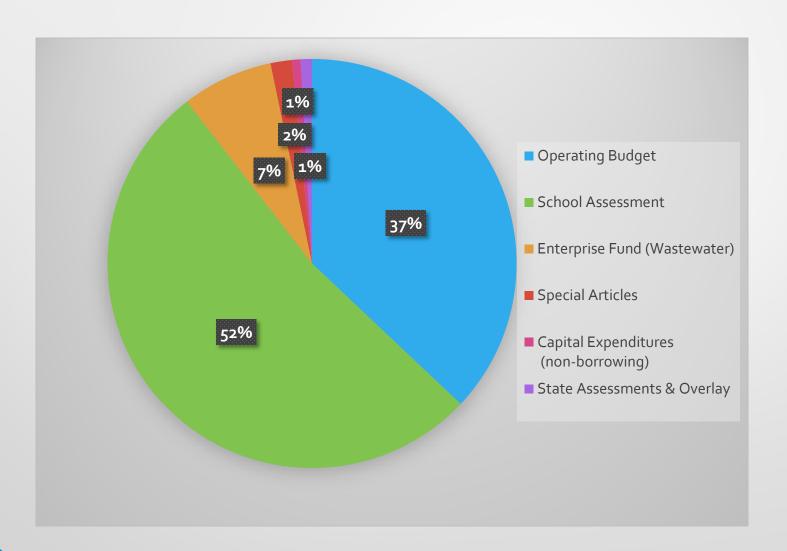
