Large Sycamore in Mahaiwe Cemetery - has suffered damage due to late frost and anthracnose, but has recently bounced back, trying to treat roots next spring but need to be careful

e. Roundabout Disease-resistant American elm (droopy cultivar)

F. Meadow & Front Scarlet oak
